In November of 2022, I was experiencing homelessness and was pregnant. I needed a place to stay and Marillac Place welcomed me right away. When I arrived, I was scared and nervous to be in a new environment and not know anyone, but I was so thankful for a safe place to stay. I was shy for the first few months, but soon became more comfortable. For the most part I kept to myself while focusing on my goals and working.

The staff at Marillac Place are amazing people! They are super friendly and were always there when I needed them. I really loved how they were not judgmental but rather understanding and always there to support me. I appreciated how staff didn't treat me like a child and always gave me space to do what I needed to do. I loved the Praise with a Raise program that allowed me to earn points each month and redeem them for things I needed for myself and my baby. Marillac Place also helped me connect to a counsellor free of charge through their counselling program. I have learned so much about being a mom with the help from the staff and programs. All I had to do was be willing to ask for help, ask questions, and be willing to learn. Whenever I needed help, they were right beside me. When it was time, they also helped me to find my own place to live and I received many items through donations made to Marillac Place to get me started.

To other moms out there - my advice would be to seek help if you really need it. Though it may be difficult to ask, it's an important step in your journey. Also, don't be embarrassed to live in a shelter. Think of it as the next stage toward a better, brighter future for you and your baby!



Period Poverty and the UW Period Purse Program





Unfortunately, these access barriers are further exacerbated by taboo and societal stigma surrounding menstruation. This hesitancy to talk about menstruation is part of the problem, as it prevents productive discussions surrounding the status quo which, in turn, hinders progress and change.

UW Period Purse is a club at the University of Waterloo dedicated to education, advocacy, and fundraising in support of those facing period poverty. Our goal is to increase access to menstrual products at UW as well as providing support to local organizations.

Through fundraising efforts and generous donations from sponsors, we were able to purchase an assortment of menstrual products including pads, tampons, and liners. After discovering Marillac Place and all the wonderful work they do to support young mothers and mothers to be, we were inspired to create menstrual care packages for current and past clients.

Over 20 members of the club gathered together for a "packing party," to assemble 99 packages containing pads, tampons, liners, and wipes. In addition to providing tangible support, we also included uplifting, positive, and motivational messages in each box.
